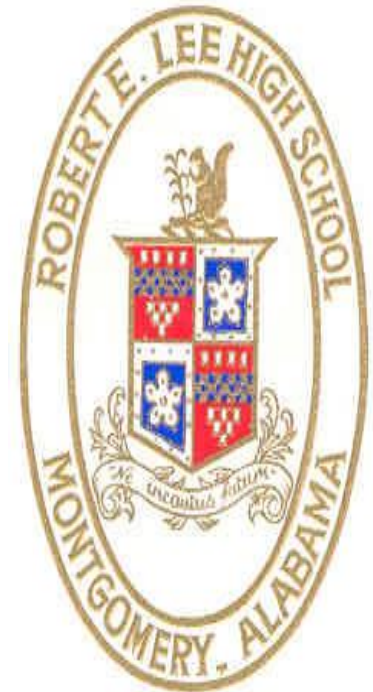

The faculty and staff of Robert E Lee High School, and the parents of the students participating in activities, services, and programs funded by Title I, Part A of the Every Student Succeeds Act of 2015 (ESSA), agree that this compact outlines how the parents, the entire school staff, and the students will share the responsibility for improved student academic achievement and the means by which the school and parents will build and develop a partnership that will help children achieve the State's high standards.

School Responsibilities

Robert E. Lee High School will:

1. Provide high-quality curriculum and instruction in a supportive and effective learning environment that enables the participating student to meet the State's academic achievement standards as follows.
 - Robert E. Lee High School offers a broad-based curriculum with specific outcomes designed to improve student performance and growth. All subjects are required to fulfill and meet state-based standards as outlined in the subject curriculums used at Robert E. Lee High School. These curriculums adhere to and follow the standards outlined by the Montgomery Public Schools. The curriculum is presented in a supportive atmosphere conducive for learning.
2. Hold an annual parent meeting to discuss the school-parent compact and its connection to student achievement.
 - *Parents are encouraged to attend the PTA, open house and to schedule parent-teacher conferences after the initial progress reports are distributed. Parents are also encouraged to attend the annual Parent meeting.*

3. Provide parents with frequent reports on their children's progress. Specially, the school will provide the following reports as listed below:

Progress reports will be provided every four weeks; the progress reports will be given to the students to take home to their parents. Report cards will be distributed four times a year; the report cards will be given to the students to take home to their parents. Parents will have access their child's information on a daily basis by using the PowerSchool parent portal.

4. Provide parents reasonable access to staff. The staff will be available for consultation with parents as follows:

- *Parent/teacher conferences must be scheduled in advance at the designated time that is set by the administration. Parent conferences will take place after school. Teachers will meet with parents in the media center. Parent-teacher conferences will be scheduled through the Guidance office. Teachers will be available for conferences after the first progress report is distributed.*

5. Provide parents opportunities to volunteer, visit their student's class, and to observe classroom activities, as follows:

- *Parents may observe classroom activities during school hours. Parents may volunteer in designated areas of the building.*

Parent Responsibilities
